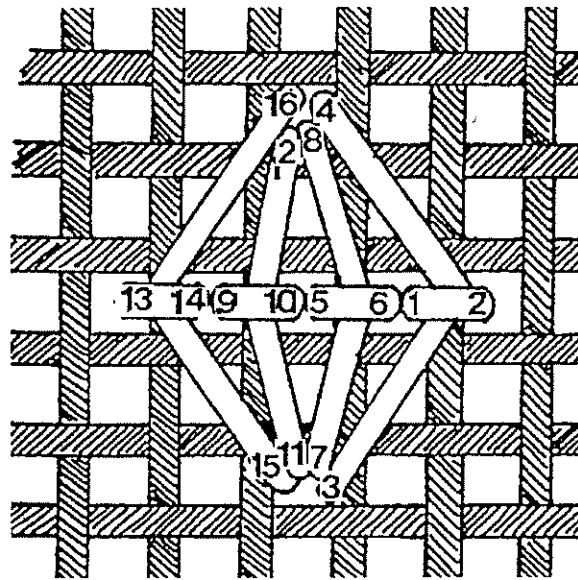


Queen Stitch - new version

- Work the Queen Stitch using one strand of thread for silk and two strands of thread for stranded cotton floss. The stitch diagram included here may be different than the traditional diagram. I find it to be more “stitcher friendly” than other methods. The best part about this method is that the point on the left side of the stitch will be as strong as the point on the right side. It looks slightly unorthodox, but after a trial period I think you will find this method easier. You will also find that this stitch lends itself to a “sew” rather than “stab” method and will remind you a little of working a lazy daisy stitch. To begin bring your needle up at #1 and leave a big loop toward the bottom of the stitch as you go down at #2 then bring your needle up at stitch #3 being sure the needle is inside the loop. Pull the thread through the linen, eliminating the loop.
